

Discovering the world's first street photo

Have you ever wondered how the very first photograph came to be? The story begins with a picture called <u>"Boulevard du Temple in Paris</u>", taken by Louis Daguerre. This photograph is

special because it's considered the first one to include a human figure. In the early days of photography, capturing moving subjects was quite a challenge. Exposure times were long, often lasting several minutes. As a result, people and objects in motion seemed to vanish from photographs, making city scenes look empty.

However, "Boulevard du Temple" changed this. In the photo, a shoe shiner and a client stood still for about ten minutes, allowing their images to be captured.
